

BOARD OF EDUCATION
UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT NO 229
RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING ESTABLISHMENT
OF PETTY CASH FUNDS

WHEREAS, Kansas law , K.S.A. 72-8208, permits the Board of Education of any school district to authorize the establishment of petty cash funds from which needed expenditures are made for school district purposes in emergencies; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of Unified School District No. 229 hereby determines that it should authorize the establishment of petty cash funds at Blue Valley High School, Blue Valley North High School, Blue Valley Northwest High School, Blue Valley Southwest High School, Blue Valley West High School, Center for Advanced Professional Studies (CAPS), Aubry Bend Middle School, Blue Valley Middle School, Harmony Middle School, Lakewood Middle School, Leawood Middle School, Overland Trail Middle School, Oxford Middle School, Pleasant Ridge Middle School, Prairie Star Middle School, Wolf Springs Middle School, Blue Valley Academy, Aspen Grove Elementary School, Blue River Elementary School, Cedar Hills Elementary School, Cottonwood Point Elementary School, Harmony Elementary School, Heartland Elementary School, Hilltop Learning Center, Indian Valley Elementary School, Lakewood Elementary School, Leawood Elementary School, Liberty View Elementary School, Mission Trail Elementary School, Morse Elementary School, Oak Hill Elementary School, Overland Trail Elementary School, Prairie Star Elementary School, Stanley Elementary School, Stilwell Elementary School, Sunrise Point Elementary School, Sunset Ridge Elementary School, Timber Creek Elementary School, Valley Park Elementary School, Wolf Springs Elementary School, Business and Finance and Special Services for the purpose of making needed expenditures for school district purposes in emergencies; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education hereby determines that the amount of money kept in any one petty cash fund shall not exceed \$1,500.00; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education hereby determines that the principal of each attendance facility and the administrator in charge of any other facility should be authorized and required to administer said petty cash fund as prescribed by law.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Education of Unified School District No. 229 that the establishment of petty cash funds at Blue Valley High School, Blue Valley North High School, Blue Valley Northwest High School, Blue Valley Southwest High School, Blue Valley West High School, Center for Advanced Professional Studies (CAPS), Aubry Bend Middle School, Blue Valley Middle School, Harmony Middle School, Lakewood Middle School, Leawood Middle School, Overland Trail Middle School, Oxford Middle School, Pleasant Ridge Middle School, Prairie Star Middle School, Wolf Springs Middle School, Blue Valley Academy, Aspen Grove Elementary School, Blue River Elementary School, Cedar Hills Elementary School, Cottonwood Point Elementary School, Harmony Elementary School, Heartland Elementary School, Hilltop Learning Center, Indian Valley Elementary School, Lakewood Elementary School, Leawood Elementary School, Liberty View Elementary School, Mission Trail Elementary School, Morse Elementary School, Oak Hill Elementary School, Overland Trail Elementary School, Prairie Star Elementary School, Stanley Elementary School, Stilwell Elementary School, Sunrise Point Elementary School, Sunset Ridge Elementary School, Timber Creek Elementary School, Valley Park Elementary School, Wolf Springs Elementary School, Business and Finance and Special Services is hereby authorized for the purpose of making needed expenditures for school district purposes in emergencies; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the principal of each attendance facility and the administrator in charge of each other facility is authorized and required to administer said petty cash fund as prescribed by law and that the amount of money in each such fund shall not exceed \$1,500.00.
